

Open Space and Recreation Plans are...

- → a tool communities use to plan for conservation and recreation needs.
- make the community eligible for state grant funding.
- reviewed and approved by the Division of Conservation Services.
- relevant for 7 years and then require updating.





What do we mean by open-space?

- Any land or area that...
- → (1) conserve and enhance natural or scenic resources
- → (2) protect streams or water supply
- (3) promote conservation of soils, wetlands, beaches, or tidal marshes
- → (4) enhance the value to the public of abutting or neighboring parks, forests, wildlife preserves, nature reservations, or sanctuaries
- → (5) enhance recreation opportunities



Open Spaces include:

- Lakes and Rivers
- → State Parks
- → Preserves and Land Trusts
- Town Lands- parks, cemeteries, beaches
- → Farms
- Forests and wetlands
- Wildlife Management Areas
- Private land in Conservation Restriction or tax abatement program




Open Spaces in Monterey include:

- Lake Garfield, Lake Buel, other waterbodies.
- → Beartown State Forest
- → Greene Park
- → Bidwell Park (across from Greene Park)
- Monterey Town Beach
- Community Center Grounds
- → Bob's Trail, Steadman Pond, Diane's Trail
- → Appalachian Trail
- → Bidwell House Grounds/Trails
- → Brewer's Pond Trail
- → Local Farms

Timeline of the Process:

- Use results of public forum, committee feedback, Master Plan document to develop an online survey (December, 2023).
- Collect survey responses from community regarding Open Spaces in town (January/February 2024.)
- Use survey feedback to draft additional open space goals in town (March/April 2024.)
- → Present findings to community (April/May 2024)
- Present Draft document for community review (mid-May.)
- → Submit Draft document for state review (June 30, 2024)




Q1: What are the three top reasons that you choose to live in Monterey?

Q4: How satisfied are you with the following recreation areas in Monterey?



Q6: What infrastructure project or improvement do you think should be a priority in Monterey (Choose 3)?






Q10: If the town was to develop land behind Town Hall/ on Fox Hill, what use would Mentimeter benefit the town the most? (Rank your choices)

The Community Preservation Act

Allows communities to establish a dedicated fund for:



Open Space





Historic Preservation





Affordable Housing



Basics of the Act

- Local adoption needed
- Establishes up to a 3% surcharge on local property taxes
- Requires 10% of monies to be spent on each of the 3 categories
- Allows flexibility for the remaining 70% in each of the 3 categories
- Establishes a Community
 Preservation Committee









Available CPA Exemptions



- Property owned <u>and</u> occupied by a person who qualifies for <u>low income housing</u> or <u>low</u> or moderate income senior housing
- Commercial and industrial properties in cities or towns with classified tax rates
- \$100,000 of the value of each taxable parcel of residential real property





Q17: Would you support the town's adoption of the Community Preservation Act, or CPA, to facilitate projects in open space, historical preservation, and affordable housing? (CPA) allows communities to create a local Community Preservation Fund for open space protection, historic preservation, affordable housing and outdoor recreation. Community preservation monies are raised locally through the imposition of a surcharge of not more than 3% of the tax levy against real property, and municipalities must adopt CPA by ballot referendum. This enables towns to leverage state money to finance projects in open space protection/outdoor recreation, historic preservation, and affordable housing. (https://www.communitypreservation. org)











How often do you use the following open space sites in Monterey?










Open Space ideas we didn't have time to address:
