

Conservation Commission Meeting September 10, 1990

The chair read the Notice of Public Hearing. The legal right of way isn't defined very well. They want to eliminate the corrugated plastic pipe. They will put up hay bales. Install a new catch basin.

Ray, John, Art made the original inspection.

There is to be an 8' high concrete wall across the front of the house and then they will fill in behind it. The deck was in the driveway. They will restore the ditch. They will raise the road to get better turn on driveway. It is not a convenient driveway This makes for better drainage. Everything below the haybales has been seeded and has grass.

Conrad Ohman state that the cc was concerned that what wad proposed is what is being done.

RB explained that the engineer has no legal responsibility to see that it is built properly.

Inspections will have to be part of the O of C.

John Camp. RDA

Wants to put an addition on his cottage. Second floor and back the house has no storage space now. There will be a change to the roof line. The project will be done after the drawdown.

There will be digging for the piers only No foundation. The drainage on the lot will still drain the same way. Silt barriers and hay bales are to be left in place at least until next spring. The commission determined this project to be Non-Applicable.

Leavitt

They want to build a foundation under an existing cottage. There will be a minimum of fill. Water will shed to the side of the cottage not towards the lake. The main carrying beam is cracked. The outside wall is deteriorating. They will start after the drawdown.

O of C Second row of haybales at the end of the culvert going onto the lake to stabilize the culverts.

Germain continued hearing

Further information was requested

Lengthy discussion with Mrs Germain trying to get a better handle on the elevations and profile of this project. It was decided to write a letter to the contractor and request still further more specific information. He will be invited to discuss the project with Ray Tryon. Ray stated the conversation would have to be face to face as he would not try to describe it over the phone.

The members voted to keep the hearing open and request further information. The vote was in favor 4 members voted to continue and 2 members abstained.

Lake Garfield Assoc

Barbara Resnick introduced herself to the commission as the new chairman of the Lake Garfield Assoc. They have hired consultants to look into the weed problem in the lake.

The secretary was instructed to send a letter to the Board of Selectmen to tell them to begin a full drawdown of the lake. Commence Oct 1 and complete Oct 15.
