Hi Melissa and Jim W,

Title 5 report attached. Please forward to Jim Hunt also, as I could not locate an email for him, and thank him for all the digging help in locating the system.

Items of Note: I completed the report as a Conditional Pass. The primary issue is that we could not get the pump chamber alarm to work. I'm not sure if its the float or the alarm unit itself; both seemed suspect. the Pump works fine.

Other repairs necessary, as discussed with Jim Hunt the day of inspection:

• Replace about 20' of settled/bellied sewer line into the south end of the septic tank (see sketch, page 16). It was holding quite a bit of liquid and solids.

 Replace SAS vent pipe; use new pipe and glue in place. (heads up, theres a birds nest with chicks inside the 90's on the current pipe.)


Other recommended maintenance items (but not necessarily required to Pass) include:

- Pump the septic tank while it is open. Confirmed size is 1500-gallon twocompartment
- Add 6" more of risers to the tank inlet and outlet. This will bring them right to grade, and both sides of the tank can then be easily accessed for pumping.
- Add a filter to the effluent tee; the tee/baffle are in excellent condition

Relative to playground upgrades, information on the D-box and SAS trench locations are on the sketch, page 16, with distance ties. The trenches and D-box concrete were in excellent condition. The top of the D-box is 2.5' below grade, and tops of trenches are about 3' below grade. I marked D-box and trench locations with orange flags in the field (but they may not have lasted long out there depending on playground activity). I believe any work done within 2' of current grade shouldn't impact the septic. Any playground work planned deeper than 2' below grade will need to be worked around the septic SAS component locations.

**RE:** Examples of Noise Bylaws

Date: March 6, 2023

You have expressed interest in seeing some other municipality's noise bylaws that approach regulation under an "unreasonable noise" vs. a decibel level standard. Attached are bylaws currently in place in four communities: Hanover, Hamilton, Plymouth, and Shutesbury. Please let Donna and me know if you'd like to incorporate any of these approaches to your draft.

### Hanover:

### Article 1. Purposes

This Bylaw is adopted to ensure the residents of the Town of Hanover an environment free of excessive sound that may jeopardize or degrade their quality of life. This Bylaw shall be applied to control all noise originating within the geographical limits of the Town of Hanover.

### Article 2. Definitions

All terminology used in this By-law, but not defined below, shall be used with the meanings ascribed to such terms in the applicable standards of the American National Standards Institute ("ANSI") or its successor bodies.

### 2.1. Construction:

Any site preparation, assembly, erection, substantial repair, alteration or similar action, but excluding demolition for, or of, public or private rights-of-way, structures, utilities, or similar property.

### 2.2. Demolition:

Any dismantling, intentional destruction of, or removal of, structures, utilities, public or private rights-of-way surfaces or similar property.

### 2.3. Emergency Work:

Any work performed for the purpose of preventing or alleviating the physical harm to persons or property, which requires immediate action.

### 2.4. Enforcement Official:

Any Town official having authority to enforce this By-law as provided in Section 3.C.

### 2.5. Legal Holiday:

Any day designated as a legal holiday under Federal or Massachusetts State Law.

### 2.6. Noise Disturbance:

Any sound which may

- (a) disturb or annoy reasonable persons of normal sensitivities;
- (b) cause, or tend to cause, an adverse effect on the public health and welfare;
- (c) endangers or injures persons; or (d) endangers or injures real or personal property.

### 2.7. Person:

Any individual, association, partnership, joint venture, corporation or other form of legal entity.

### 2.8. Plain Audible Sound:

Sound as to which the information content is unambiguously communicated to the listener including, without limitation, understandable speech, comprehension of whether a voice is raised or normal, repetitive bass sounds, or comprehension of musical rhythms, without the aid of any listening device.

### 2.9. Power Tool:

Any device powered mechanically, by electricity, by gasoline, by diesel or any other fuel, which is intended to be used, or is actually used, for functions including, without limitation, cutting, nailing, stapling, sawing, vacuuming or drilling.

### 2.10 Public Right-of-Way:

Any highway, boulevard, street, avenue, lane, sidewalk, or similar place, which is owned or controlled by a government agency.

### 2.11 Public Property:

Any real property, including structures thereon, which are owned or controlled by a government entity.

### 2.12 Residential District:

Any area designated as a Residential District in the Town of Hanover Zoning By-law.

### 2.13 Weekday:

Any day from Monday through Friday that is not a Legal Holiday.

Article 3. Permitting and Enforcement of Ordinance

- 3.1. For the purpose of this By-law a Noise Permit shall be obtained with the Town of Hanover's Building Office for all purposes which have not been specified in Section 6: Specific Activities or listed in Section 7: Exemptions and Permits.
- 3.2. For the purpose of this By-law the Building Commissioner of the Town of Hanover is hereby charged with the granting of all Noise Permits, there shall be no permit fee for said permit application. Noise Permit applications shall be acted upon within fourteen (14) business days of permit filing with the Building Department. If the Building Commissioner determines that the noise permit application comply with all applicable provisions of this By-law; or if not acted upon within fourteen (14) business days shall be deemed approved.
- 3.3. Enforcement Officials. This By-law shall be enforced by the Chief of Police, the Building Commissioner and/or Local Building Official. Designees of the Chief of Police shall include any Hanover Police Officer.
- 3.4. Penalties for Violation. Violations of this By-law shall be punishable by fine in accordance with the following schedule:

Offense	Fine
First	\$ 75
Second	\$150
Third and Subsequent	\$300

Violations resulting from sound emanating from a particular parcel of property will be assessed against the person controlling said property at the time of the violation, regardless of said person's legal status as owner, lessor, tenant-at-will, and licensee or otherwise. Nothing contained in this By-law shall prohibit an Enforcement Officer from giving a warning in lieu of a fine if, in the Official's discretion, a warning is appropriate under the circumstances.

3.5. Fines. In assessing fines for violations of this By-law, the Enforcement Official shall follow the procedure set forth in M.G.L. c. 40, § 21D.

Article 4. Duties and Responsibilities of Town Boards and Officials

- 4.1. Town programs and activities. All Town Departments, Boards and Officials shall carry out their programs and activities in a manner reasonably consistent with this Bylaw.
- 4.2. Project review and approval. All Town Departments, Boards and Officials having responsibility for the review and approval of new projects or activities', or changes to existing projects that result, or may result, in the production of sound shall, to the extent reasonably feasible under the circumstances, require compliance with the provisions of this By-law as a condition of approval. This By-law is not intended to require any Town Department, Board or Official to apply a more restrictive standard for the approval of any project or activity, or change to any existing projects, than has been applied prior to the By-law's adoption.
- 4.3. Projects and developments that have received permitting and approval by all Town Departments, Boards and Officials shall be held to noise provision of said permit.

### Article 5. Non-Accessory Signs

- 5.1. No person shall make, continue, or cause to be made or continued, any noise disturbance. Unamplified, non-commercial public speaking and public assembly activities conducted at conversational voice levels on any public property or public right-of-way shall be exempt from the operation of this section if such sound is not plainly audible beyond 100 feet or does not infringe the legitimate rights of others.
- 5.2. The facts required to establish a noise disturbance shall be identical to those required to establish a disturbance of peace under common law (and punishable under M.G.L. c. 272 § 53). Violations of this By- law need only be proven by a preponderance of the evidence.

### Article 6. Specific Activities

The following activities are permitted as set forth below:

- 6.1. Construction, Demolition and Commercial Landscaping Activity are allowed to operate or permit the operation of any tools or equipment used in construction, demolition or commercial landscaping work in a Residential District between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Weekdays (Monday thru Friday) or between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on any other day.
- 6.2. Domestic Power Tools. Persons shall operate, or permit the operation of, any power tool or any garden tool, leaf blower, chain saw or similar device powered mechanically, by electricity, gasoline, diesel or other fuel, outdoors in a Residential District between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
- 6.3. Dumpsters and Trash Receptacles. Persons/Businesses shall empty dumpsters or similar trash receptacles between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Weekdays (Monday-Friday) or between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on any other day.

### Article 7. Exemptions and Permits

The following uses and activities shall be exempt from the provisions of this By-law:

- 7.1. Any law enforcement motor vehicle in the performance of law enforcement duties.
- 7.2. Any law enforcement, public safety training facility to include the Hanover Police Firing Range.
- 7.3. Any fire apparatus, ambulance, rescue, public works or emergency response vehicle creating sound in the performance of public safety responsibilities.
- 7.4. Any vehicle in the performance of emergency work.
- 7.5. Public address systems used at public events in a manner approved by any Town Board, Department or Official having authority over said use.
- 7.6. Safety signals, warning devices, emergency pressure relief valves and similar devices during and in relation to public emergencies.
- 7.7. Parades, music festivals, public gatherings, and events for which the permit granting authority has granted a noise permit.
- 7.8. Bells, chimes or carillons, or amplified, recorded, or other electronic substitution while being used in conjunction with religious services or to denote time intervals.
- 7.9. Snow removal from public or private parking lots, roads, driveways, sidewalks and other surfaces traveled by vehicles or pedestrians.
- 7.10. Activities of temporary duration during a time of emergency conducted by a public utility company to repair or maintain public utility infrastructure.
- 7.11. Construction activity under a valid noise permit issued by the Building Commissioner under section 7 or 15 of Chapter 136 of the Massachusetts General Laws, or by any Town Board or Department having regulatory authority over construction activity.
- 7.12. Any vehicle utilizing an amplified communications system operated by a highway maintenance, water department, or public utilities worker acting in the performance of his or her responsibilities.
- 7.13. Any noise originating from a preexisting municipal structure prior to the adoption of this Bylaw which serves and protects the general health safety and welfare of a Hanover residence.

7.14. This Bylaw shall not prevent the use of any mechanical device or equipment used to mitigate emergency conditions or an event by any persons, homeowners, business owner, or Town department.

7.15. Any activity to the extent the regulation thereof has been preempted by State or Federal Laws or Regulations.

Article 8. Appeal

Appeal of any citation for a violation of this By-law shall be made to the District Court or other Court of competent jurisdiction in accordance with the provisions of M.G.L. c. 40, § 21D.

Article 9. Severability

If any of the provisions of this By-law are held to be invalid by any Court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

### Hamilton:

SECTION 13. Noise By-Law

A. Definitions. As used by this by-law, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

"Noise"- a sound that is plainly audible at a distance of 150 feet from its source and which disturbs the reasonable quiet, comfort, repose, or health of others.

"Plainly Audible" - Any sound from a source regulated by this by-law that can be detected above routine or normal ambient background sound by unaided human hearing.

"Sound Amplification System" - Any fixed or portable system to operate or amplify sound, including, but not limited to, phonograph, radio, television, stereo, record player, tape player, cassette player, compact disk player, digital music player, "boom box," or loud speaker.

B. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to cause or allow any Noise that emanates from any building, boat, structure, vehicle, premises, or any Sound Amplification System, which is plainly audible at a distance of 150 feet from its source. The fact that the Noise is plainly audible at a distance of 150 feet from the building, structure, vehicle, boat, premises or Sound Amplification System in which or from which it originates shall constitute prima facie evidence of a violation of this by-law.

- C. Sounding horns excessively. It shall be unlawful to sound or use automobile, truck or other motor vehicle horns or similar signaling devices upon the public streets, parking lots, or thoroughfares of the Town in excess of those signals necessary for the preservation of safety.
- D. For the purposes of this by-law, Noise shall include loading or unloading activities, use of power tools and equipment, use of lawn or landscaping equipment, loud outcries, and other loud or boisterous sounds which are not specifically exempted by subsection F and which occur outside of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
- E. Penalties for violation. Whoever violates this by-law shall be subject to enforcement action by non- criminal disposition as provided in M.G.L. c. 40, Sec. 21D and Chapter XIII of the Town By-laws. The first violation of this by-law may be punished by a verbal warning or a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00). The second violation of this by-law within 12 months after the first violation shall be punished by a fine of two hundred dollars (\$200.00). Further violations within 12 months after the last violation shall be punished by a fine of three hundred dollars (\$300.00). Each such act, which either continues or is repeated more than one-half (1/2) hour after issuance of a verbal warning or fine for violation of this by-law, shall be a separate offense and shall be prosecuted as a separate offense.

This By-law shall be enforced by the Hamilton Police Department. Any person aggrieved by the imposition of a fine under this by-law may, within twenty (20) days of the imposition of the fine, request a hearing before the Town Manager, who may set aside the fine.

- (1) If the person or persons responsible for violation(s) of this by-law cannot be determined, then the person in lawful custody and/or control of the premises where the violation(s) occurred, including but not limited to the owner, lessee, manager, or occupant of the property, may be held responsible for the violation(s).
- F. Exemptions. The following uses and activities shall be exempt from this by-law:
- (1) Any Public Safety motor vehicle using any communication or signaling device necessary in the performance of its operator's duties.
- (2) Any highway maintenance, water department, or public utilities activities and/or vehicles, while engaged in necessary emergency business.
- (3) Announcing systems at sanctioned sporting or other authorized public events between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
- (4) Noises of safety signals, warning devices and emergency pressure relief valves.
- (5) Noises resulting from activities of a temporary duration permitted by law and/or for which a license or permit has been granted by the Town.

- (6) Parades, music festivals, public gatherings, and events for which the Selectmen have issued a permit.
- (7) Bells, chimes, carillons, or other call to prayer, or amplified, recorded, or other electronic substitution while being used for religious purposes, in conjunction with religious services, between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
- (8) Snow removal/road sanding from private parking lots, drives, roadways, and other vehicle- or pedestrian-traveled surfaces.
- (9) Noises for which the Board of Selectmen has granted a special permit pursuant to section G, below.
- (10) Noise resulting from activities of any agricultural operation between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.
- (11) Noise generated by animals.
- (12) Noise resulting from the operation of boats for recreation. G. Application for permit for relief.
- (1) Application for a permit for relief from this by-law on the basis of undue hardship may be made to the Board of Selectmen.
- (2) Any permit granted by the Selectmen shall set forth all conditions pertaining to the specified noise and a reasonable time limit for its abatement.
- (3) The holders of licenses to provide alcoholic beverages and/or entertainment shall comply with any noise allowances and/or restrictions imposed upon such licenses, and in the case of a conflict between individual license allowances or restrictions and this by-law, the terms of the license shall apply, and a violation of any such allowances or restrictions shall also constitute a violation of this by-law.
- H. Severability clause. If any part of this by-law is deemed to be contrary to state or federal law, that part can be severed without affecting any other part of this by-law.

### Plymouth:

Chapter 120 NOISE

 $\S$  120-1. Persons occupying or having charge of premises.  $\S$  120-2. Persons present at location where noise originates.

[HISTORY: Adopted by the Annual Town Meeting of the Town of Plymouth 4-11-1988 by Art. 20. Amendments noted where applicable.]

§ 120-1. Persons occupying or having charge of premises. [Amended 6-28-1993 STM by Art. 6; Amended 4-10-2001 by ATM Article 31]

- 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons occupying or having charge of any building, structure, vehicle or premises or any part thereof in the town to cause or suffer or allow any unnecessary, loud, excessive or unusual noises in the operation of any radio, phonograph or other mechanical sound-making device or instrument, or reproducing device or instrument, or in the playing of any band, orchestra, musician or group of musicians, or in the use of any device to amplify the aforesaid, or the making of loud outcries, exclamations or other loud or boisterous noise or loud and boisterous singing by any person or group of persons, or in the use of any device to amplify the aforesaid noise, where the noise is plainly audible at a distance of 150 feet from the building, structure, vehicle or premises in which or from which it is produced.
- 2. The fact that the noise is plainly audible at a distance of 150 feet from the building, structure, vehicle or premises from which it originates shall constitute prima facie evidence of a violation of this section.
- 3. Any person violating this section shall be punished by a fine of \$50 for each offense.

§ 120-2. Persons present at location where noise originates. [Amended 4-3-1993 STM by Art. 15]

A. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons being present in or about any building, dwelling, premises, shelter, boat or conveyance, or any part thereof, to cause or suffer or countenance any loud, unnecessary, excessive or unusual noises in the operation of any radio, phonograph or other mechanical sound- making device or instrument, or reproducing device or instrument, or in the playing of any band, orchestra, musician or group of musicians or the making of loud outcries, exclamations or other loud or boisterous noise or loud and boisterous singing by any person or group of persons, or in the use of any device to amplify the aforesaid noise, where the aforesaid noise is plainly audible at a distance of 150 feet from the building, dwelling, premises, shelter, boat or conveyance in which or from which it is produced.

- 2. The fact that the noise is plainly audible at a distance of 150 feet from the premises from which it originates shall constitute prima facie evidence of a violation of this section.
- 3. Any person shall be deemed in violation of this section who shall make, or aid or cause or suffer or countenance or assist in the making of, the aforesaid and described improper noises, disturbance or breach of the peace, and the presence of any person or persons in or about the building, dwelling, premises, shelter, boat or conveyance or any part thereof during a violation of this section shall constitute prima facie evidence that he or she is a countenancer to such violation.
- C. Any person violating this section shall be punished by a fine of \$50 for each offense.

### Shutesbury:

### PROHIBITION OF EXCESSIVE NOISE:

No person(s) shall create, assist in creating, continue or allow to continue any excessive, unnecessary or unusually loud noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures, or endangers the reasonable quiet, comfort, repose or health or safety of others within the Town of Shutesbury.

### **EXEMPTIONS**

The following shall not be deemed violations of this bylaw:

Noise generated while engaged in necessary business by any police, fire, or Town equipment or vehicles.

Noise generated by any construction, maintenance or repair vehicles or equipment between the hours of 7 AM and 9 PM.

### PENALTIES:

Any person(s) violating this bylaw shall be punished by a fine of \$25.00 for each second and subsequent offense. The first such offense shall be addressed as a warning by the enforcing person(s). Any act which either continues or is repeated more than thirty minutes after a warning or violation notice is issued shall be a separate offense, and each subsequent thirty minute period of an ongoing disturbance shall constitute subsequent offenses. If the person(s) responsible for the offense cannot be determined, then the person in lawful custody or control of the premises, including but not limited to the owner, lessee or occupant of the property on which the activity is located, shall be deemed responsible for the violation.

ENFORCING PERSONS: ANY POLICE OFFICER OR CONSTABLE WITH JURISDICTION, SELECT BOARD, DOG OFFICER
