ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$3,100,000 to pay costs of designing, renovating, constructing an addition to, originally equipping, and furnishing the Monterey Library, including the payment of all other costs incidental and related thereto, and that to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer, with the approval of the Board of Selectmen, is authorized to borrow said sum under and pursuant to Chapter 44, Section 7(1) of the Massachusetts General Laws, or any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the Town therefor, provided, however, that a majority of voters casting a ballot thereon, vote in the affirmative to exempt from the provisions of Proposition 2½ so-called, the amounts required to pay for the principal and interest on bonds or notes issued for the project, and provided, further, that no borrowing shall take place until such time as the Town receives written notification, that it will receive a grant of no less than \$1,800,000 from The Commonwealth of Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners, and that the Town of Monterey has received and executed a Library Construction Grant Agreement with the Commonwealth with respect to this project. The amount authorized to be borrowed by this vote shall be reduced to the extent of all grants received by the Town from The Commonwealth of Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners on account of this project. Any premium received by the Town upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this vote, less any such premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to the payment of costs approved by this vote in accordance with Chapter 44, Section 20 of the General Laws, thereby reducing the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay such costs by a like amount or take any other action relative thereto. **(2/3 vote required, secret ballot)**

ARTICLE 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 or any other sum for the Southern Berkshire Regional Emergency Planning Committee Town Assessment, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 or any other sum for repairs and maintenance of the Bally Gally house on the former Wilson McLaughlin property, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend a MassWorks Grant from the Massworks Infrastructure Program in the amount of \$1,000,000, and sum will be used for Safety Improvements Project/Bridge Replacement on Curtis Rd, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept all federal and state grants, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 32. To see if the town will vote to approve the following changes and additions to the Monterey Zoning Bylaws **Section 10 Definitions:**

Dwelling: Any building that contains either one or two dwelling units used, intended, or designed, to be built used, rented, leased, let, or hired out to be occupied or that are occupied for living purposes.

Dwelling, Multi-Family: A residential building containing three (3) or more dwelling units with a maximum of six (6) dwelling units allowed.

Dwelling, Single Family: A single unit providing complete independent living facilities for one of more persons, including permanent provision for living, sleeping, eating, cooking, and sanitation.

Primary Dwelling Unit (PDU): A single family dwelling on a building lot that is a minimum of two acres with 200 feet of road frontage, and is associated with a secondary dwelling unit (SDU).

Secondary Dwelling Unit (SDU): A self-contained housing unit that is either attached to a single-family dwelling, or may be detached, is itself a dwelling unit, and is located on the same lot and complies with the provisions of this bylaw.

To see if the town will vote to approve the following change to the Monterey Zoning Bylaws **Section 3.1.3 Table of Use Regulations**. The proposal is to change the words/number “two/2 or more” to “three/3 or more”:

ARTICLE 33. To see if the town will vote to approve the following changes to the Monterey Zoning

Bylaws **Section 4.1.2 Number of dwellings per building lot:**

4.1.2 Number of dwellings per building lot. As a use by right, no building lot (two acres and 200 feet of road frontage) may contain more than one primary dwelling unit (PDU) and one secondary dwelling unit (SDU). Nonconforming lots may apply for a secondary dwelling unit through a special permit from the Zoning Board of Appeals, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 34. To see if the town will vote to approve the following changes and additions to the Monterey Zoning Bylaws **Section 7.3 Multifamily Dwellings**

Replace strike-thru with table below:

7.3.4 Lot Area and Frontage. Lots shall contain a minimum of two (2) acres for the first dwelling unit and three (3) acres for each additional unit and two hundred (200) feet of frontage for the first unit and one hundred (100) feet of frontage for each additional unit. Land lying within the Lake Shore District may not be included as qualifying acreage for multi-family dwellings.

7.3.4 Lot Area and Frontage. Lot area and frontage requirements for multi-family dwellings (three -3- or more dwelling units with a maximum of 6 dwelling units in any one building):

Multi-family Dwelling Unit	Lot area	Minimum Road Frontage
3 Dwelling Units	3 acres	300 feet

Land in the Lake Shore District may not be included as qualifying acreage for multi-family dwellings.

7.3.6 Conversion of Single Family Dwelling. The conversion of a single-family dwelling into a multi-family dwelling of two **three or more** units, without meeting the requirements as to lot area and frontage

and as to setbacks may be permitted by the Board of Appeals by special permit, provided that; or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 35. To see if the town will vote to approve changing the Monterey Zoning Bylaws Section **9.5 Site Plan Review** by changing “2/two” to “3/three”:

9.5.1 Applicability. The following types of activities and uses require site plan review by the Planning Board:

1. Construction, exterior alteration or exterior expansion of, or change of use within, an institutional, commercial, industrial, non-municipal educational or religious use, or residential structure with two **three** or more dwelling units;
2. Construction or expansion of a parking lot for a municipal, institutional, commercial, industrial, non-municipal educational or religious use, or residential structure with two **three** or more dwelling units;
3. Common driveway pursuant to Section 7.1;
4. Large scale ground mounted solar photovoltaic facility., or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 36. To see if the town will vote to approve the following changes to the Monterey Zoning Bylaws Section **6.2 Signs**:

6.2.7 Signs Not Requiring Permits.

4. Signs announcing public events sponsored by civic or social organizations to be displayed for not more than fourteen (14) **thirty (30)** days prior to the event. The Select Board may grant size waivers for these temporary signs, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 37. To see if the Town will vote pursuant to G.L. c. 268A, section 21A, to authorize commissions or boards to appoint members to any office or position under the supervision of such commission or board, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 38. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Treasurer to use available funds in the Treasury or, with the approval of the Select Board, to borrow money in anticipation of reimbursement by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts on account of Highway Capital Funds, in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 44, Section 6A, and to issue notes therefore for a period not to exceed two years from this date, and the proceeds from such reimbursement shall be applied to discharge the loan, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 39. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Select Board, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning July 1, 2017, in accordance with the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 44, Section 4, and to issue a note or notes therefore, payable within one year, and to renew any note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year, in accordance with General Laws Chapter 44, Section 17, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 40. To see if the Town will vote to appoint any committee or officers and them or any other officer of the Town instructions, authority or indemnity thought best, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 41. ARTICLE 42. Citizen Petition. To see if the Town will vote to approve this non-binding resolution: That there be no use of chemical herbicides in Lake Garfield for the next five years.

ARTICLE 43. 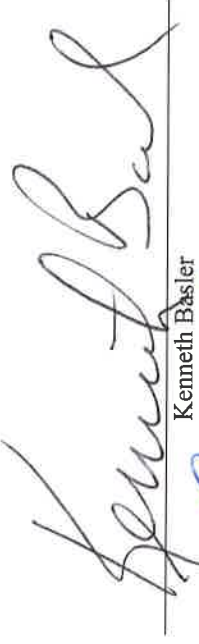
